

[**A** Key Verses **8**]

Acts 13:45 – *When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy. They began to contradict what Paul saying and heaped abuse on him.*

Acts 13:46 – *Then Paul and Barnabus answered them boldly: "We had to speak the word of God to you first. Since you reject it and do not consider yourselves worthy of eternal life,, we now turn to the Gentiles.*

Acts 13:47 – *For this is what the LORD has commanded us: "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth."*

Acts 13:48 – *When the Gentiles heard this, they were very glad and thanked the LORD for Paul's message.*

Ephesians 6:12 – *For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.*

Luke 2:46 – *And it came to pass, after three days, they found Him in the Temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, both hearing them and questioning them.*

Luke 2:47 – *"Were amazed then all those hearing Him at the understanding and the answers of Him."*

Luke 2:48 – *And having seen Him, they were astonished, and said to Him the mother of Him, Child, why have you done thus to us? Behold the father of You and I, distressing, were seeking You.*

awe – 'an emotion variously combining dread, veneration and wonder'

[2] **ah-KOON-tah**

hearing – 'to listen closely for the purpose of understanding and comprehending what is being said'

[1] **ah-POKE-rise-sin**

answers – 'thoughtful, or well-reasoned responses'

teachers – ‘instructors, masters or teachers’
- [2] **DZAY-lou**
jealousy – ‘to boil over with emotional fervor’
- [1] **eh-per-oh-RON-tah**
questioning – ‘to interrogate, or to make demand of’
- [1] **eh-ZET-too-men**
seeking – ‘to seek or search diligently for something with the intent of finding it’

have you done – ‘to cause, to manufacture, or to accomplish’
- [41] **eye-DON-tes**
having seen – ‘to see with the eyes’
- [1] **ex-eh-PLAG-geh-san**
they were astonished – ‘to be struck out of one’s senses, gob smacked, or with an outcome of being totally dumbfounded’

amazed – ‘to be beside oneself, to be out of one’s mind’

thus – ‘a demonstrative pronoun, thus, this, like, etc’
- [1] **kath-EZ-zoe-men-on**
sitting – ‘sitting or dwelling’
- [29] **MEH-so**
midst – ‘the sole focus of’
- [2] **oh-din-NO-men-oi**
distressing – ‘to be tormented, to be in anguish or to suffer acute pain’

understanding – ‘intelligence, insight or practical discernment’

child – ‘offspring, young one, or one who is childish’
