

[ **A** Key Verses **11** ]

**John 6:70** – *Jesus answered them, "Did I Myself not choose you, the twelve, and yet one of you is a devil?"*

**John 6:71** – *Now He meant Judas the son of Simon Iscariot, for he, one of the twelve, was going to betray Him.*

**John 13:21** – *"Truly, Truly, I say to you that one of you will betray Me."*

**John 13:22** – *The disciples began looking at one another, at a loss to know of which one He was speaking.*

**John 13:24** – *So Simon Peter gestured to him and said to him, "Tell us who it is of whom He is speaking."*

**John 13:25** – *He, leaning back thus on Jesus bosom, said to Him, "LORD, who is it?"*

**John 13:26** – *Jesus then answered, "That is the one for whom I shall dip the morsel and give it to him." So when He had dipped the morsel, He took and gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot.*

**John 13:27** – *"And after the morsel, then entered into him—Satan." Jesus says therefore to him, 'What you do, do quickly.'*

**John 13:28** – *"Now not one of those who were reclining at the table understood for what purpose Jesus had said this to Judas."*

**John 14:1** – *"Not the heart of you be troubled, you believe in God, also in Me believe."*

**John 14:27** – *"Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful."*

**betray** – 'to deliver to the enemy by treachery'

**bewildered** – 'deeply or utterly confounded'

**hypocrite** – 'one who behaves or acts in direct contradiction to their stated beliefs'

**treachery** – 'a violation of allegiance or of faith and confidence'
