John 14:26 – *However, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom will send the Father in the name of Me, He will teach you all things and will bring remembrance to you all things that I have said to you.”*

righteous – ‘someone being virtuous or just, both in terms of their relationship with God and their conduct toward others’

he will turn – ‘to turn, to return or to convert’
