

[ **A** Key Verses **4** ]

**Acts 2:38** – *“Peter then said to them, ‘Repent! he declared, and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the free gift of the Holy Spirit.’”*

**Acts 2:41** – *“Those indeed therefore having received the word of him were baptized; and were added on that day of that, souls about three thousand.”*

**Acts 4:4** – *“Many however of those having heard the word believed, and became the number of the men about five thousand.”*

**Mark 16:16** – *“The one having believed and having been baptized shall be saved; but the one however having disbelieved shall be condemned.”*

[ **B** Definitions **5** ]

**ablution** – *‘the washing of one’s body (as a religious rite)’*

**compunction** – *‘anxiety arising from the awareness of guilt’*

**epiphany** – *‘a usually sudden manifestation or perception of the essential nature or meaning of something’*

**persuaded** – *‘to be moved by argument, entreaty or expostulation to a belief, position or course of action’*

**whelmed** – *‘to turn something upside down so as to cover and engulf completely’*

- [1] **ah-pis-TAY-sas**  
having disbelieved – ‘the refusal to be persuaded, or to betray a trust, to be unfaithful’
- [1] **ah-po-DEX-an-men-oi**  
having received – ‘receive heartily, to gladly welcome or receive willingly into the mind’
- [1] **bap-TIS-they-toe**  
be baptized – ‘to immerse, to submerge or to make whelmed’
- [3] **bap-TIS-they-sis**  
baptism – ‘to immerse, to submerge or to make whelmed’
- [5] **dor-ree-AN**  
free gift – ‘a gift given without cost, for not charge and having no requisite to pay’
- [3] **eh-bap-TIS-theh-san**  
were baptized – ‘to be immersed, submerged or to be dipped under’
- [22] **ep-pis-TOY-san**  
believed – ‘to believe, to have faith or to be persuaded’
- [18] **fay-SIN**  
he declared – ‘to affirm, to bring to light, or to strongly assert one’s point of view’
- [1] **kat-tah-RITH-set-tie**  
will be condemned – ‘to be condemned by having received a judgment’
- [2] **meh-tah-no-SAH-tay**  
repent – ‘to think differently or have a change of heart after something takes place, by reconsidering a moral principle, all the while feeling compunction’
- [95] **ON-om-ah-tee**  
name – ‘the full manifestation of someone’s character, which distinguishes them from all others’
- [2] **pis-TOY-sas**  
having believed – ‘to commit, entrust, or to have faith’
- [13] **so-THES-seh-tie**  
will be saved – ‘to be preserved, protected or delivered safely’
