

## [ A Key Verses 10 ]

**Exodus 30:10** – *Once a year Aaron shall make atonement on its horns. This annual atonement must be made with the blood of the atoning sin offering for the generations to come. It is most holy to the LORD*

**Habakkuk 1:13** – *Your eyes are too pure to approve evil, and You cannot look on wickedness with favor. Why do You look with favor on those who deal treacherously? Why are you silent when the wicked swallow up those more righteous than they?*

**Hebrews 9:7** – *But only the high priest entered the inner room, and that only once a year, and never without blood, which he offered himself and for the sins of the people had committed in ignorance.*

**Isaiah 59:1** – *Behold, the LORD's hand is not too short that it cannot save; nor is His ear so dull that it cannot hear.*

**Isaiah 59:2** – *But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God; and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He does not hear.*

**Mark 10:45** – *For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many*

**Matthew 27:46** – *About the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "ELI, ELI, LAMA SABACHTHANI?" that is, "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?"*

**Matthew 27:50** – *And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice, and yielded up His spirit.*

**Matthew 27:51** – *And behold, the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom; and the earth shook and the rocks were split.*

**Psalms 22:1** – *My God, my God, why have You forsaken me? Far from my deliverance are the words of my groaning.*

## [ B Definitions 6 ]

**Bestow** – *'to convey or transfer as with a gift or a present.'*

**Discretion** – *'an action taken which is driven by individual choice or personal judgment.'*

**Forsaken** – *'to turn away from entirely.'*

**Initiative** – *'an introductory act or step; a leading action'*

**Modern-day Pharisee** – *'one who is seeking to damage or discredit the ministry of Christ.'*

**Redeem** – *'to buy back or to repurchase.'*

**af-FECK-ken**

yielded – ‘to allow to leave, to release, to discharge or to send away or to forgive’

[1] **an-neh-BOI-sen**

to shout – ‘to shout upwards’

[2] **die-ah-con-NETH-en-high**

served – ‘to minister to, to attend to, or to wait upon’

**DOO-nigh**

to give – ‘to provide, to deliver or to bestow’

[2] **en-kah-teh-LIP-es**

forsaken – ‘to be left alone, abandoned, or to be deserted or to make anew in a new or different form’

**KRAX-as**

shouting – ‘to shout loudly with emotion’

**LYE-tron**

ransom – ‘to redeem, to pay a redemption price or to make atonement’

**MEH-gah-lay**

loud – ‘great, large or mighty’

**MEH-gas**

intense – ‘something or significant size’

**PAH-lin**

again – ‘once more, again, or a second time’

**PNYOO-mah**

spirit – ‘breath, human spirit, or the immaterial life-giving force or God’
